# Case Study: Mallwood Ltd.

### Challenges:

Construction and civil engineering projects generate significant waste from surplus materials, off-cuts, packaging, and demolition debris. Mallwood Ltd. recognized that its operations had limited controls for waste segregation, material reuse, or lifecycle tracking.

Key barriers included:

- Lack of clear internal guidance on circular economy practices
- Inconsistent waste handling practices across sites
- Low awareness among staff about environmental best practices
- Limited access to real-time training resources

Clients and regulators were also increasing expectations around circularity, placing additional pressure on the company to improve



#### Impact:

Mallwood Ltd. joined the Supply Chain Sustainability School in early 2025, aiming to close internal knowledge gaps and shift toward better resource efficiency. Our employees are now actively using the school's:

- Waste Management and Circular Economy E-learning modules
- Self-assessment tools to identify improvement areas
- Action plans to guide operational changes

Participation in School workshops and webinars has given the company access to real-world case studies, industry benchmarks, and peer learning opportunities.
